

Jesus, King of All Nations

Title Confirmed In The Bible



Is the title of Jesus, King of All Nations substantiated in the Bible? Yes, in fact beyond any reasonable doubt!

This is Daniel's vision, recorded in Daniel 7:14, concerning the son of Man, which Jesus called Himself: *"To Him was given dominion and glory and Kingdom, that all peoples, nations and languages should serve Him; His dominion is an everlasting dominion, which shall not pass away, and His Kingdom one that shall not be destroyed."*

King David wrote in Psalms 22:28-29, "All the ends of the earth will remember and turn to the Lord, and all the families of the nations will bow down before Him, for dominion belongs to the Lord and He rules over the nations."

The Psalms also tell us that God reigns on His holy throne. He is supreme. He rules the world with justice and mercy. (Psalms 47, 93, 96-99).

Jesus Christ will be seated upon His throne and He is the God of dominion (Sirach 1:4-6).

The Archangel Gabriel announced to the Blessed Virgin Mary that she would bear a son, named Jesus, who would be called the Son of God. St. Gabriel also said that the Lord God would give Jesus the throne of David and that He would rule forever and His reign would never end. (Luke 1:32-33)

In very recent times, Pope Benedict XVI referred to Daniel's vision concerning the Son of Man, Jesus, and described Jesus, King of All Nations on November 25, 2012 as follows: "These words present a King who reigns from sea to sea, to the very ends of the earth, possessed of an absolute power which will never be destroyed. This vision of the prophet, a messianic vision, is

made clear and brought to fulfillment in Christ: the power of the true Messiah, the power which will never pass away or be destroyed, is not the power of the kingdoms of the earth which rise and fall, but the power of truth and love."

Pope Benedict continued, "In this way we understand how the Kingship, proclaimed by Jesus in the parables and openly and explicitly revealed before the Roman procurator (Pilate) is the Kingship of truth, the one which gives all things their light and grandeur."

Jesus prayed for God's Kingdom to "come on earth as it is in Heaven."

In conclusion, the Blessed Virgin Mary, who appeared north of Green Bay, Wisconsin as Our Lady of Champion in 1859, the year after she appeared, in Lourdes, France, revealed to her son's secretary December 8, 2021, "I am the Immaculate Queen of Heaven and earth! Mary, the Immaculate, sinless one, the most holy Mother of God."

Our Lady went on to say, "I was sent here to this wild land to usher in the reign of my Divine Son who is Jesus, King of All Nations. I have come to prepare this chosen land in this vast country for the coming of Jesus Christ, the Sovereign Lord and King of all!"

All prophecy of the promised King is fulfilled in Jesus, King of All Nations, and to Him is "the obedience of the peoples of all nations."

Jesus is the prophesied "lion of the tribe of Judah, the root of David." (Revelation 5:5)
